Programme Structure

If you're applying for a role in Group Support, your rotations will be tailored to compliment your chosen discipline.

The Technical team are responsible for designing outstanding homes and places and making sure we stay at the cutting edge of technology and materials.




You'll also collaborate with all of our teams to ensure new developments feel like welcoming communities from day one.



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Qualifications you can receive

Interested in pursuing a professional qualification in your chosen area during or following the programme?

We aim to support you wherever possible. Depending on your discipline, this could be with:

The Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors (RICS)/ The Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI)

We have Structured Training Agreements in place with both organisations. Funding is also available to help you achieve chartered status through the Assessment of Professional Competency (APC) process.

The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW)


The ACA qualification takes between three and five years to complete, studying part time around your work commitments. It's made up of a number of elements including 450 days of work experience and 15 exam modules.

The Chartered Institute of Builders (CIOB)

The CIOB Professional Development Programme usually takes between one and three years to complete. To be eligible for this programme, you'll need a qualifying university degree.

Chartered Institute of Architectural Technologists (CIAT)

The CIAT-accredited programmes blend design, building technology, and construction management. To be eligible for this programme, you'll need a qualifying university degree.



Eligibility

- Minimum 2:2 degree-qualified or hold an equivalent or higher qualification.
- Right to work in the UK.
- Full drivers licence (except if you're applying for a role in London).

Can I apply for more than one role?

You should only apply to the one role you feel you're best suited to. However, during the ASPIRE programme, you'll have lots of opportunities to build your understanding of the wider business.


What courses will I attend?

During the programme you will have the opportunity to attend a variety of development modules, designed to give you the knowledge and skills to grow professionally.

These will focus on your personal development, as well as providing insight into our wider business, with topics ranging from 'personal growth' through to speaking to our Group Support functions.

What happens at the end of the programme?

How to apply

1. Apply online

2. Video interview and psychometric assessment

If successful, you'll be invited to a video interview, where you'll be asked about your skills, commercial awareness and motivations.
